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Descriptions of Categories:

Rubric

1. Debate skills:
 - a. Grammar and organization:
 - i. Did the delegate order his or her points understandably and appropriately?
 - ii. Did the delegate avoid slang and use complete sentences?
 - iii. Did the delegate ensure his or her key message came across using strategies like repetition?
 - b. Quality of oral delivery:
 - i. Did the delegate stand up straight and make eye contact?
 - ii. Did the delegate project adequately but refrain from yelling?
 - iii. Did the delegate speak respectfully to other delegates asking challenging questions?
 - c. Quality of questions:
 - i. Did the delegate's questions to others meaningfully further debate?
 - ii. Was the delegate able to respond to other delegates' questions about his or her bill with confidence and accuracy?
 - iii. Did the delegate effectively answer questions from others in a manner that reinforced his or her points?
2. Relevance:
 - a. Relevance to debate:
 - i. Did the delegate only raise questions pertinent to the topic of discussion?
 - ii. Did the delegate actually answer other delegates' questions rather than providing a non-answer?
 - iii. Did the delegate make clear his or her perspective and unique framing of the issue?
 - b. Relevance of technical questions:
 - i. Did the delegate's technical questions meaningfully further debate? Delegates should NOT ask technical questions simply to talk more.

Please note that raising frequent points of order or non-relevant technical questions does NOT constitute quality performance.

Guidelines for (0-5) Scoring: The following represent general guidelines evaluators should apply to each category on the score sheet. It is strongly recommended that evaluators use "3" to indicate an average performance and adjust higher or lower for stronger or weaker performances.

1 — POOR PERFORMANCE

- Poor presentation
- Inadequate knowledge of bill topic/parliamentary procedures

2 — FAIR PERFORMANCE

- Awkward presentation
- Poise and delivery need more work

3 — GOOD PERFORMANCE

- Acceptable but uninspired presentation Needs
- more creativity and persuasiveness.

4 — EXCELLENT PERFORMANCE

- Well organized; demonstrates thorough preparation.
- Smooth, engaging, creative presentation.

5 — SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE

- Demonstrates excellent preparation; well organized.
- Presentation and ideas extraordinary and realistic, not overly rehearsed or memorized.
